

WELCOME! DIRECTOR'S NOTE



In my opinion, Love's Labor's Lost is a perfect play for a summer evening. Light and airy, sure, but like so many favorite novels and films set in summertime, it's also a coming-of-age story. For many-myself included-summer feels full of potential, as though these longer days hold the promise of transformation, of growth, of returning to life in three months changed in some intangible way.

Some see it as a time to set a lofty personal goal, like committing to three years of academic study (or at least a library's summer reading challenge). For others, it's the opportunity to get out of town for a little bit, even if it is on a business trip from the French Court. For others, it's about those small-town summer flings that fizzle (or don't) as fall approaches.

In the spirit of keeping things fun and fast-paced, that ensemble of 15 characters is gamely played by just 8 actors in this production. We'll have live music played on at least 7 different instruments, as well as absurd disguises, mishandled letters, and a play-within-the-play. It is Shakespeare, after all.

THE ROYALTY - KING'S COURT

KING OF NAVARRE

Played by Zack Handlen (he/him) The King of Navarre has brought three of his lords to study with him on his island for 3 years' time.

BEROWNE

THEATRE

Played by Luke Myers (he/him)

Berowne is the last to arrive to the King's court. He is a witty, verbose speaker who maybe doesn't quite agree with the oath they are all swearing to. He falls in love with Rosaline - they've met before.

LONGAVILLE

Played by Paul Fidalgo (he/him) Longaville falls in love with Maria (and it gets weird).

DUMAINE

Played by Jonas Maines (he/him) Dumaine falls in love with Katherine.

THE ROYALTY - PRINCESS' COURT

PRINCESS OF FRANCE

Played by Hannah Daly (she/her)

The Princess' father the King is very sick. She has come to Navarre on business, expecting to be put up in a lovely coastal Maine estate. She is traveling with her three ladies and lord in waiting.

ROSALINE

Played by Kat Moraros (she/they)

Rosaline has been friends with the Princess for a long time. She falls in love with Berowne - they've met before, and she thinks he needs to chill with his idle scorns and jests.

MARIA

Played by Megan Cross (she/her) Maria falls in love with Longaville (and it gets weird).

KATHERINE

Played by Sarabell Wrigley (she/her) Katherine falls in love with Dumaine.

BOYET

Played by Paul Fidalgo (he/him) The Princess' lord in waiting. LOVE'S LABOR'S LOST CHARACTER GUIDE

THE LOCALS

COSTARD

Played by Megan Cross (she/her)

Costard is a local gardener who works on the grounds of the King's estate. He is a bit of a troublemaker, and is often sneaking off into corners or around bushes with Jaquenetta because he is crushing on her hard. Costard likes to have a good time and clown around.

JAQUENETTA

Played by Sarabell Wrigley (she/her)

Jaquenetta is a local of Navarre who has ambitions of getting off the island and out into the world. Jaquenetta is often sneaking off into corners or around bushes with Costard, and has a major crush on Don Armado.

SIR NATHANIEL

Played by Kat Moraros (she/they)

Sir Nathaniel is the local pastor. He spends his days reading, using fancy words in conversations, and applauding his mentor, Holofernes.

HOLOFERNES

Played by Paul Fidalgo (he/him)

Holofernes is a master scholar who lives on the island. He spends his days reading, using fancy words in conversations, and advising locals with his mentee, Sir Nathaniel.

FROM AWAY

DON ARMADO

Played by Jonas Maines (he/him)

Don Armado is a Spaniard who has fallen in love with Jaquenetta. He uses fancy words, writes catchy songs, and uses lots of pet names.

ΜΟΤΕ

Played by Kat Moraros (she/they) Mote is Don Armado's sidekick. He's very clever, very flirty, and always looking to have a good time.

MERCADE (any pronouns)

Played by a special guest at each performance Mercade is an official messenger from the French Court.



LOVE'S LABOR'S LOST PLOT GUIDE



1.1 THE KING'S MEN'S OATH & ISLANDERS FROLICKING

The King of Navarre and his three companions Berowne, Dumaine and Longaville commit to a studious life for three years. No women, no love, fasting, little sleep - Berowne is skeptical. To help them keep their oath, they decree that all women must remain a mile from the court. Don Adriano de Armado, a visitor from Spain, sends a letter to the King that the local gardener, Costard, has been canoodling with Jaquenetta against the King's rules. Costard is told off and handed over to Don Armado, who will keep an eye on him.



1.2 CRUSHING

Don Armado tells his page, Mote, that he's the one who is actually crushing on Jaquenetta. He tries to flirt with her and after an epic fail, decides to write her a love song.

2.1 THE PRINCESS ARRIVES WITH HER LADIES

The Princess of France and her three ladies arrive: Rosaline, Katherine, and Maria, along with her lord-in-waiting, Boyet. They are there on business because the King of France is very ill. Because of the King's oath, the women are forced to camp in the field. The Princess' ladies all know of the King's men, and it isn't long before the King and his men find themselves falling for the ladies in classic summer romance style: The King and the Princess, Berowne and Rosaline, Dumaine and Katherine, Longaville and Maria.



3.1 LOVE SONGS & LETTERS

Don Armado writes Jaquenetta a song ("Peninsula" by Paul Fidalgo) and a letter and foolishly asks Costard to deliver it. Berowne also asks Costard to deliver a love letter to Rosaline on his behalf.



4.1 & 4.2 LETTERS MISPLACED

Costard creates confusion by delivering Armado's letter to Rosaline while the ladies are playing croquet. He then goes to hang out with local parson Sir Nathaniel and professor Holofernes - two learned residents who are obsessed with books and language. Sir Nathaniel has been deer hunting. Jaquenetta arrives with the letter from Berowne that Costard intentionally gave her to thwart her would-be romance with Armado.



4.3 LOVE REVEALED

The extent to which the men have forgotten their oath is revealed as they catch each other writing love poetry. At first the King is angry that his men have broken their oaths, but then his feelings for the Princess are also forced out into the open. They make plans to visit the ladies' camp and win them over.



5.1 DON ARMADO'S PLAN

Don Armado asks Holofernes and Sir Nathaniel to help him present a play for the Princess at the King's request. Holofernes suggests "The Nine Worthies". Roles are assigned and excitement builds.

5.2 DISGUISES & TRUTH TELLING

The ladies receive a delivery of jewelry, gifts and love letters from the men. Boyet tells them the men are arriving in disguise. The ladies decide to mess with the men by swapping gifts and pretending to be each other (Rosaline as "Princess" and vice versa, Maria as "Katherine" and vice versa). The men arrive in disguise as Russians a la Eurovision band and play music for the ladies. They all split off into couples (the wrong ones, unknown to the men) and the men all give them musical tokens of love.

Frustrated with getting nowhere in their wooing, the men leave. The ladies swap their original gifts back and prepare for their return. When the men arrive as themselves, the ladies force them to admit they were in disguise and question their ability to keep an oath.

Don Armado, Costard, Sir Nathaniel, Mote, and Holofernes arrive to present "The Nine Worthies". The men make fun of the actors. Don Armado and Jaquenetta are about to run off together in love, but Costard makes a musical plea for her affections. Don Armado and Costard get into a fight over Jaquenetta, which devolves into chaos for everyone.



THE END

Sad news arrives for the Princess and she needs to immediately return home. The King and his men hastily ask for their hands in marriage. The ladies, unconvinced that their love is genuine, declare that the men must wait a year to prove that what they say is true, giving each of them an assignment of how they should spend their time. Everyone sings a bittersweet song ("Leap Year" by Paul Fidalgo), as they pack up and part ways.
