THE SETTING

Welcome to the court. Duke Frederick has seized power, banished his sister Duke Senior to the Forest of Arden, and won't hesitate to banish anyone else who displeases him. Watch your back.

QUICK PLOT SUMMARY: SPOLIERS!

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- · Rosalind is banished from court by her tyrannical uncle, Duke Frederick, and flees to the Forest of Arden with her cousin Celia and court fool Touchstone.
- There, disguised as a young man named Ganymede, Rosalind encounters Orlando, whom she has fallen for. Orlando, also in the forest to escape his brother Oliver's plots, begins to woo Rosalind (as Ganymede).
- Rosalind encounters the lovesick shepherd Silvius who is wooing Phoebe and a love triangle forms.
- The play explores themes of love and jealousy, gender exploration and identity, and the structures of society vs the freedoms of nature.

Wait, what's happening with the love triangles?







1. JEALOUS BROTHERS AND POWER PLAYS

Duke Frederick has taken power from his sister Duke Senior and banished her from the court. Orlando has been mistreated by his older brother, Oliver, who hasn't allowed him to be raised like the gentleman he should be. Orlando demands his inheritance from Oliver and they tousle despite their old servant Adam telling them to play nice. Charles the wrestler shows up. Because Oliver is jealous of how much other people like Orlando, he tells Charles it's ok if he ends up hurting or killing Orlando in the wrestling match.

2. WRESTLING AND FALLING IN LOVE

Rosalind is unhappy because of her mother Duke Senior being banished. Her cousin Celia, the daughter of Duke Frederick, tries to cheer Rosalind up. Their bestie, the court fool Touchstone, tells them the wrestling match is coming. Orlando talks with Rosalind and she starts to fall for him. Orlando wins the match against Charles. Duke Frederick is displeased when he learns Orlando's parentage. Rosalind gives Orlando a necklace and they both fall more in love. Touchstone warns Orlando he should leave court because Duke Frederick is wrathful.

3. BANISHMENT

Rosalind is head over heels for Orlando, and takes a while to admit it to Celia. Duke Frederick interrupts and banishes Rosalind because he doesn't trust her anymore. (The people like her too much and it's dangerous for his power plays.) Celia pleads for Rosalind's case. Ride-or-die Celia tells Rosalind they'll head out to the forest of Arden together. Rosalind is excited about dressing as a man named "Ganymede", and Celia chooses the name "Aliena." They get Touchstone, rally with a song, and flee the court.



4. GET OUT OF HERE!

Adam tells Orlando that Oliver plans to burn Orlando's lodgings down while he's sleeping inside, and urges him to flee. Orlando needs his inheritance first – so Adam gives Orlando his life savings to sustain his departure and they head out together.



5. OLIVER'S DOWNFALL

Duke Frederick is pissed that Orlando has fled the court, suspecting that Celia, Rosalind, and Touchstone are with him. Duke Frederick siezes all of Oliver's lands and wealth and demands he bring Orlando - dead or alive - back to the court.



6. CHEERILY, GOOD ADAM

Adam is very frail and needs to take a break in the journey. Orlando promises to go find him some food.

7. ALL THE WORLD'S A STAGE

- Duke Senior is making the best of banishment, working hand-in-hand with her followers and trying to comfort them as they navigate life in the woods. Her camp contemplates nature and the beauty of the world. Jaques, usually melancholy, appears talking about a fool he met in the woods who made him laugh! (This is unusal for Jaques; now he wants to be a fool).
- Orlando interrupts, accosting the camp and demanding their food. Duke Senior encourages him to just ask for what he needs, and offers him food and gentleness. Orlando is touched, and leaves to go bring Adam to the camp.
- Jaques is inspired to deliver the famous "All the world's a stage" speech, Adam and Orlando return, and are fully welcomed into Duke Senior's circle.



8. A NEW LIFE IN ARDEN

Rosalind, Celia, and Touchstone arrive in Arden. Celia is hangry and Touchstone misses the finery of the court. They hide as young shepherd Silvius appears with old shepherd Corin. Silvius shares how deeply in love he is with the shepherdess Phoebe. Rosalind (as Ganymede) talks to Corin and asks him to buy the cottage and flock on their behalf.

9. LOVE LETTERS EVERYWHERE!

Orlando is so in love with Rosalind that he's writing love poetry and putting it on ALL the trees!



10. COUNTRY LIFE AND MEETING AGAIN

- Touchstone misses life in court, and talks to Corin about country life. Rosalind shows up reading Orlando's love notes; Touchstone teases her about their quality. Rosalind begs Celia to tell her who wrote the letters, and wants to know everything about Celia's encounter with Orlando.
- Orlando shows up having an awkward but good-mannered interaction with Jaques.
- Rosalind approaches Orlando as Ganymede and tells him that she knows how to "cure" lovesick men. At first Orlando insists he's so happily in love he wouldn't be cured. Rosalind tells him she'd cure him if he comes every day to her cottage to "woo" her, calling her "Rosalind". Orlando is so drawn to Ganymede that he agrees.



Touchstone has fallen fast and hard for a shepherd named Audrey. Audrey longs to be a man of the world, and has also fallen hard for Touchstone. Touchstone proposes, they sing a rousing song, and Jaques urges them to go seek a priest and get married the "right" way, not just wildly in the woods.



12. WHERE IS HE?

Rosalind is grumpy that Orlando didn't come on time for his wooing session. Corin brings them to watch Silvius attempting to woo Phoebe.





13. THE RED GLOW OF SCORN

Silvius sings a song to try to win Phoebe's heart. She's not having it. Rosalind interrupts as Ganymede and urges Phoebe to look on Silvius better, calling him a good man and letting her know she's being too prideful. It backfires and Phoebe falls hard for Ganymede. Rosalind makes a hasty retreat.

• Phoebe works through her feelings for Ganymede, then decides to write him a letter that she'll send via Silvius as messenger.



14. YOU'RE LATE! LET'S PLAY PRETEND.

Rosalind playfully berates Orlando for showing up late to his wooing session. Orlando plays along as Rosalind-acting-as-Ganymede-pretending-tobe-Rosalind begins the wooing games. Rosalind makes Celia act as a priest during a pretend wedding. Orlando has to go dine with Duke Senior, and promises to come back within two hours. Rosalind is SOOOOO in love!



15. YOU'RE LATE AGAIN! LOVE LETTERS AND OLIVER'S TRANSFORMATION

- Orlando doesn't show up on time. Silvius arrives with a letter from Phoebe. Turns out it's a love letter asking Ganymede to send a love letter back via Silvius. Rosalind tells Silvius to tell Phoebe that Phoebe should love Silvius and Ganymede will never have her.
- Oliver arrives with a bloody handkerchief! Celia ("Aliena") and Oliver fall hard and fast in love. Oliver explains how Orlando rescued him from a lioness, and Orlando's arm was injured which is why he didn't show up for wooing on time. This experience has completely changed him, and he's no longer a bad guy.
- Rosalind faints and Celia asks Oliver to help carry Ganymede home.



16. LOVE CONFUSION

- Touchstone and Audrey return, not married yet.
- Orlando and Oliver make up, and Oliver bestows his entire fortune on Orlando because he's so happy to start a new country life with "Aliena". Oliver and "Aliena" plan to get married the next day.
- Rosalind wants to keep playing love games, but Orlando is longing so hard for Rosalind that she decides to reveal herself and marry him the next day.
- Phoebe shows up, angry that Rosalind showed her letter to Silvius, and orders Silvius to explain what it means to love. Love triangles ensue, Phoebe starts to really see and hear Silvius, and finally Rosalind makes a plan to clear everything up if everyone meets together the next day.



THE END.

- Duke Senior, Jaques, and all the couples show up. Jaques is excited to see the fool (Touchstone) again.
- Rosalind reveals herself to her mother and to Orlando, and they both finally see her for who she really is.
- When Phoebe sees the love between Orlando and Rosalind, she is happy to turn her affection toward Silvius.
- Duke Senior welcomes Rosalind & Celia back into her life, and calls for music!
- Rosalind delivers the epilogue, and then everyone celebrates the power of love and empathy.
